Dear Parents and Carers

You may be aware that, as a part of your child's educational experience at Great Orton Primary School, we are required to provide Relationships and Health education, to prepare our pupils for the journey ahead of them. It is also recommended that schools teach ageappropriate Sex education, where appropriate. We are aware that these topics may be of a sensitive nature and aim to provide full transparency of our curriculum, to ensure that parents/carers are aware of the content covered.

We use the KAPOW PSHE scheme which encompasses all the statutory requirements as well as some age-appropriate non-statutory content, with the more sensitive content being taught in our Safety and my Changing Body topic. We have included an overview of each year group below, followed by some of the key vocabulary that we will be using. We continue to teach PSHE in the year groups seen below rather than in classes. EYFS children have PSHE separately as part of their continued provision.

The text in red shows the content from which children can be withdrawn, if requested by their parent/carer. Please note that although children can be withdrawn from some of the recommended content in our PSHE, the statutory requirements in Science require reproduction in a mammal to be taught in primary school.
